1. Welcome and Introductions

The Chair welcomed attendees to the meeting.

The welcome was extended to the residents who had come regarding the potential Rectory Farm development. AA suggested there would have been more attending but they were put off by the sign on the door saying that the meeting was cancelled. RS said that he had put the sign on the door as the meeting was to be at the VC Hall on the 5th April.

BB went on to outline the history of the group for the benefit of the visitors, the consultation that had taken place and the professional support received. Finally the position regarding the potential option of the Rectory Farm site was described.

2. Apologies for absence

Bob Sparham, Kathy Sparham, Richard Coombs, Annie Newman, David Wright, John Preston David has been unwell for some time and the meeting wished him a speedy recovery.

3. To confirm and agree minutes of the meeting 25TH February 2016

4. Matters arising and actions from those minutes

5. Declarations of Interest

6. Police Issues Presentation - Liam Palmer

The number of police office locations had been reduced, the closure of Bottesford Police Station had been offset by the offer of accommodation at Belvoir High School. Reorganisation has led to fewer police officers on the ground and there were just two police offers and 2 PCSOs to patrol the rural area to the north of Melton Mowbray. This area is 120 square miles and includes 39 villages and 14 parishes.

However there were few issues with patrolling although the Skateboard Park at Bottesford has resulted in some problems with anti-social behaviour partly because of poor lighting. However good lighting provides a location for people to congregate and anti-social behavior had been noted around

youth centres and fenced football pitches in Melton.

CL mentioned the advice we had received from CABE on aids to 'social policing' such as designing out dead ends to paths and including windows in the gable ends of housing.

Liam stated that if we wanted advice on security aspects of developments we could ask them for advice. BB requested that the police be invited to the relevant Rectory Farm workshop. Liam was thanked for his attendance and input to the meeting and then left.

7. Development Updates

It was noted that an application had been submitted for 4 homes on the Daybell's site, these were the ones in the purple area of the previously circulated site map. The notice was dated 16th March and there are 21 days from that date to make any response. AG commented that the application was being considered at the next Parish Council meeting.

8. Parish Council update.

The March meeting had been postponed. The Parish Council was not going to be asked for any further funds for the NP.

9. Draft response to the Melton Local Plan Emerging Options (Draft) document

The final draft response had been circulated on the 8th March and was going to be considered for approval by the Parish Council on the 31st March. RS requested that the Steering Group approve the document so that it could be submitted as the official response of the NP Steering Group. CL proposed that it be accepted and it was seconded by CG, the meeting then approved the response. CG requested that a vote of thanks be recorded for the team (SL,RL,RC,RS).

10. Writing the Bottesford Neighbourhood Plan

RS had enlisted the assistance of RCC to find a Neighbourhood Plan that we could use for guidance on the format of Bottesford Parish Neighbourhood Plan. John Preston had suggested Market Bosworth as a similar village and had also sent details of suitable reference documents.

RS commented that the writing of the response had taken some time and requested additional help for writing the Neighbourhood Plan. At first it was suggested that each chapter was written by an individual but it was thought that the flow of the document would be impeded if written in that way. BB asked if the team that wrote the Response to the MLPEO were happy to take part and this was confirmed as agreed at the December meeting of the SG (SL,RL,RC,ANe). RS and PD would also take part and CL and CG would work in partnership. BB asked if we could enlist RCC to do a first draft, RS said that JP was in Australia and was not due back until the 12th April.

The Plan writers agreed to arrange a meeting.
